Another Success Story for Conservation Club

Skies were sunny, temperatures were comfortable and the beef, pork and desserts were tasty at the annual Bruce Peninsula Sportsmen's Association (BPSA) Beef & Pork Barbecue. On July 13th more than 240 guests enjoyed the feast which is the largest fund raiser of the year for the conservation club. Profits from this event support BPSA fish stocking, stream rehabilitation, firearms safety training, target shooting, archery, tree planting and our invasive species awareness project which includes installing "boot scrubbers" at Grey-Bruce trails and parks.



35 volunteer BPSA members staged the event at the group's clubhouse west of Wiarton. Each meal ticket came with a draw ticket for three major prizes. The winner of a new Barbecue donated by BPSA was Dave Myatt of the Lake Huron Fishing Club. Linda Weir took home a powerful portable generator donated by Charlie Robertson. Dan Colborne will be smoking his fish in his new smoker donated by Gary Fisher.



BBQ chair Murray Garniss said "our volunteers did a super job putting this together." He noted "most of the volunteers have staged this event before and all went smoothly once again."



The BRUCE PENINSULA SPORTSMEN'S ASSOCIATION was established in 1962 to preserve and protect fish and wildlife. Member volunteers, male and female, young and old, have stocked over 4-million sports fish in Grey-Bruce waters. It's estimated each fish stocked is worth 30 dollars to the community where it is stocked. Tourism officials credit our club's efforts with helping pump \$18-million into our regional economy. BPSA boasts Ontario's longest operating volunteer run fish hatchery.

South Bruce Peninsula Mayor Janice Jackson

South Bruce Peninsula Mayor Janice Jackson told the chamber meeting five developers are interested in a possible hotel project at the Former Wiarnton Foodland site. She announced that all major infrastructures such as outdated water and waste water pipes in Wiarnton will be replaced. The Mayor said there's "lots of fun stuff going on... we are determined to move our town forward."



Paul Deacon President

As President Paul Deacon proudly noted, for the first time the chamber now has 102 members. He predicted further growth this coming year as more business people understand and appreciate the positive community work the chamber does. Deacon called for the urgent need to "streamline the process, to make it easier to get developers projects approved in Wiarnton". He said "we need to improve the handling of developer's projects to move our town forward with positive growth". Deacon said the town has been working on this "but we're not there yet".



South Bruce Peninsula Economic Development chief Dannielle Edwards

South Bruce Peninsula Economic Development chief Dannielle Edwards reported Grey-Bruce hosts two point five million visitors a year who spend nearly 3-million dollars. She suggests a major year round hotel would go a long way towards keeping those guests in Wiarnton for longer periods. She is working on finding grants to partially fund a feasibility study to determine if a year new hotel can in her words "work for Wiarnton."



The economic development director also told me she is interested in going fishing on Colpoy's Bay. So call her at town hall if you think you can take her out for a fish-catching experience. As a fish stocking organization, we have always cited the huge value of sports fishing to our economy. MNRF studies have shown each fish stocked is worth 30-dollars to the community where it is stocked.
