












Early Bird Handgun Club Membership Draw

Hatchery Work on Yearling Rainbow Trout

Now celebrating 56-years of conservation success, BPSA operates the longest running volunteer/community fish-stocking program in Ontario. Each year we stock thousands of rainbow and brown trout. Last year we planted 89-thousand rainbow trout. In fact since the sixties, we have helped beef up our sports fishery by stocking more than 4-million trout in Grey-Bruce waters.

As of this writing the BPSA hatchery boasts 35-thousand rainbow yearlings that will be stocked in about 3 months. The fish are larger than the rainbow trout we raised last year. We also have 32 thousand brown trout eggs that are developing well.

Our Fish Committee volunteers continuously work towards maximizing the survival rate of the fish we are raising. With that in mind, early on a bitterly cold Sunday morning, a dozen BPSA members gathered at our hatchery West of Wiarton. The project at hand was to re-distribute half of our rainbow trout to separate tanks as the tank they were in was over-crowded. Over-crowding can negatively affect the growth rate of the fish. Both groups of rainbow are now evenly distributed which will increase their growth rate and give them a better chance of survival when stocked as yearlings.

Our hatchery operates under licenses from the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry and the Ontario Ministry of the Environment. BPSA is part of the 40-member Ontario Community Hatchery Program run for the province

by the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters. Half of our hatchery costs are covered by the Hatchery Program.

BPSA boasts several annual community events including our KIDS FISHING Day, the BPSA Annual Fishing Derby for members and guests, and our BEEF & PORK BARBECUE our largest fund raiser of the year. We are enthusiastic participants in the annual Wiarton Fall Fair. We are a member of the Wiarton District Chamber of Commerce.

Our 250-member club operates archery and shooting sports education and safety programs for youth and adults. We have launched a "BOOT SCRUBBER program" aimed at preventing the spread of invasive species in our forests parks, trails and waterfronts. We are working with the Bruce Trail folks and hope to install dozens of new scrubbers at the entrances to many regional trails.
