"The National" visits BPSA

A three person News crew working with the CBC TV Network newscast "The National" recently visited the Bruce Peninsula Sportsmen's Association clubhouse seeking views on firearms. They were specifically looking for reaction to suggestions being studied by Ottawa that have upset licensed firearms owners who mostly live in rural areas. The session was hosted by our BPSA Handgun Club and arranged by Bruce-Grey-Owen Sound MP Larry Miller. One suggestion being studied by Cabinet Minister Bill Blair

would require firearms owners to store their firearms at a central storage facility rather than store their guns at home. Opponents of this idea reject it saying the storage facilities would instantly become a target for criminals seeking large quantities of firearms.

Another proposal to "ban all handguns in Canada" is totally rejected by thousands of handgun owners who use these firearms for target shooting or own them as collectors. Less then 3 per cent of all firearms crimes in Canada are committed by licensed firearms owners.

These proposals if accepted by the Trudeau government, are seen as an easy way for the Liberals to win votes in large cities where gun crimes are common.

The three person crew was led by documentary maker

Terrence Mckenna who did the interviews. Camera operator Richard Agecoutay worked hard setting up 3 cameras to shoot different sequences. Producer Mai Sheldon made suggestions and helped move the work along. Mckenna interviewed BPSA member MP Larry Miller, Miller's assistant Diane Ackert, and BPSA Firearms trainer Frank Hutter. The crew also shot visuals of Hutter, Handgun Club President Al Hunter, VP Kat McCulloch and Krista Quesnel in action on our range.

Producer Sheldon promises to contact us with information on when the item will air on THE NATIONAL.


