The BPSA range is very busy these days. In addition to being in use 5 days a week by the Handgun Club, it's busy with community activities on Sundays with our annual Youth Firearms Safety Program and our Ladies Program.

On Sunday, Jan. 19/20, the club was full of young shooters and their parents as 34 youngsters were signed up for the six week program headed by Rob and Krista Quesnel. The session begins with a classroom firearms safety session followed by live fire sessions in the range. Right size .22 cal. rifles and ammunition are provided by the BPSA and one on one mentoring is provided by experienced shooters and range safety officers from the Handgun Club.

A range rules and firearm safety orientation was conducted by Frank Hutter and then shooting began in the range. Several range safety officers work with the ladies to ensure safety and to mentor new shooters. .22 cal. rifles and ammunition are provided by the club for those shooters without a firearm.
