## BPSA Fish Stocking Veteran Honoured

In honour of his more than 50 years of service to our Grey-Bruce community, long time Bruce Peninsula Sportsmen's Association (BPSA) member Ray Marklevitz has been presented with the Queen Elizabeth 11 Platinum Jubilee coin. The presentation was made Thursday September 1st at the Royal Canadian Legion branch in Wiarton. Ray noted his fish stocking efforts date back to 1968. Over many years he served in many roles including club President, fishery chair, property and hatchery manager.

Making the presentation MP Alex Ruff congratulated Ray for his "tireless efforts with the Bruce Peninsula Sportsmen's Association stocking fish for the sports fishery." The volunteer based BPSA group has stocked millions of fish in Colpoy's Bay since the early sixties.

Marklevitz beamed with pride accepting the honour saying he very much appreciates how our politicians support the efforts of the volunteers who work year round raising and stocking fish in the Wiarton area. Ray praised his fellow fish stockers making sure everyone knows "it is a team effort." At the Friday night presentation ceremony ten others from across Grey-Bruce received the same Jubilee coin. A total of seventy such coins are being presented in this riding of Bruce-Grey-Owen Sound. In Ruff's words *"its a way of recognizing deserving Canadians, deserving constituents in our respective ridings."* 



### Salmon Spectacular Fish Derby Tent Raising

The SALMON SPECTACULAR Fishing Derby and Festival attracted 5-thousand anglers and 40-thousand visitors to the tent. It hosts top notch concerts, bingo, fish frys, prize awards and new this year the "KIDS POND" where youngsters can win prizes catching rainbow trout.

Thirty BPSA members, many in their seventies, showed up to continue a tradition that's decades old. That is helping the neighbouring Sydenham Sportsmen erect and tear down the big top tent. This year with 20 other volunteers the setup was safely completed in three-and-a half hours.

Derby Co-Chair Chris Geberdt profusely thanked the BPSA members saying "we couldn't do all this without you....thanks for being our partners." The raising and tearing down of the tent saves the Sydenham club ten thousand dollars. That's what it would cost to pay the tent rental company to do the work.

This years SALMON SPECTACULAR offered over 150-thousand dollars in prizes, including 26 boats and a wide array of valuable outdoors equipment.
