VIP Guest Vist **Results in OFAH Affilation**

Two guests visited the BPSA hatchery and their visit turned out to be historic for our club. It happened on September 28th the night of our first fall BPSA general membership meeting.

Ontario Federation of Anglers & Hunters Executive Director Angelo Lombardo and Kim Staples, the OFAH's Member Services Manager, toured our hatchery with BPSA President Carl Jones and Hatchery Manager Al Sutter. After the tour Lombardo told our members "you folks have something special here, your fish stocking program and all the other conservation projects you do are something to be proud of, make sure you work hard to protect what you have."



Lombardo also said he was "totally impressed with your continuing efforts to engage youngsters in what you do, that's important because they are the future of conservation groups like BPSA."

Staples and Lombardo outlined the mandate and scope of OFAH. It has 725 Affiliated Clubs and over 100,000 members, subscribers and supporters. It is a major lobby group and has been representing the interests of anglers and hunters for over 95-years. As a federation, it offers its members liability insurance (\$5 million per member) and extra coverage for the directors/executive. It provides members with the Ontario Out of Doors magazine, a number of federation online information services, and discounts on merchandise with several companies and insurance brokers.

BPSA Director AI Sutter told the meeting our association benefits directly from OFAH through the Community Hatchery Program (CHP) which OFAH operates with funding from the Province. CHP designates where Ontario funded monies will be apportioned. Their grants provide approximately one-half of our hatchery's operating funds. Al attributed much of our hatchery operation's success to the Community Hatchery Program.

OFAH VOTE:

Later in the meeting we discussed the possibility of BPSA officially affiliating with OFAH with the federation insurance coverage for members a main selling point. After discussion, Stu Paterson moved that BPSA should affiliate with OFAH as a member club, effective immediately. The motion was seconded by Kat McCulloch and was carried unanimously.

With OFAH affiliation, ALL BPSA members must become OFAH members. We discussed our 2024 membership rates. Family membership as an OFAH affiliate provides liability insurance for children up to 25 years of age as long as they live in the same household. Our Youth membership fee for BPSA will remain unchanged at \$25 a year. BPSA Vice President Kelly Lang's motion was unanimously approved that BPSA would move forward with OFAH affiliation for 100% of our membership with Adult fees at \$90 and Family at \$115 and Youth at \$25. The new membership rates include BPSA and OFAH fees and will provide our members with insurance that BPSA President Carl Jones noted "assures us that all members including the kids are covered without our members having to pay extra for family coverage and our volunteers will be covered when taking part in all BPSA activities." Carl added "it's a WIN - WIN, there are no negatives for the future of BPSA by affiliating with OFAH." And the next step in this process?

BPSA Membership Directors Marg and Jerry Beaver, who researched this affiliation move, will coordinate with OFAH head office to work out details of the switch to affiliation, which takes place at the start of 2024.

BPSA boasts the longest running Community Fish Hatchery in Ontario. The 300-member non-profit volunteer-based club, was established in the sixties to "enhance and protect fish and wildlife."

Hypothermia Lesson

It took place at the October BPSA monthly meeting. The class was conducted by Debbra Gibson a former paramedic, Canadian Coast Guard Rescue Specialist and BPSA member. Debbra knows a lot about this subject. In fact this is a subject that we should all know more about, considering we will soon be ice fishing, skiing, snowmobiling, or skating.



So what is HYPOTHERMIA?

"Hypothermia is a condition involving

a low body temperature, usually below 35c (95°F). Shivering, pale skin, unclear speech, and a fast heart rate can be signs of hypothermia. It is a medical emergency. The stages of hypothermia range from mild to severe. Even the mild stage is an emergency, and a bystander should call 911 if they notice its signs. While waiting for help to arrive, first aid treatment entails getting the individual to a warm, dry place and removing any wet clothing."

Gibson told us "a severely hypothermic person is very fragile, their body can no longer support itself..heart failure is a very real risk."

And that "hypothermia doesn't develop for 30 minutes or more even in ice water. It will lead to unconsciousness and drowning if the dunked person doesn't stay above the water." The former first responder reviewed the many stages of hypothermia and left us with what she called "a major takeaway from what we know about cold water immersion."

"PLEASE JUST WEAR A LIFE JACKET OR A FLOAT

SUIT...it will let you survive the first minute when you are most likely to die of drowning or a heart attack. It will buy you more time for rescuers to find you and help you"

Wiarton Remembrance Preperation

It took a small army of volunteers to prepare the Wiarton Ceontaph for Remembrance Ceremonies.

Much of the display had been re-built, including a new backwall. The work done by a talented team from Cape Croker. Now the final touches were needed.

Volunteers with the Wiarton Royal Canadian Legion Branch ...and the conservation group the Bruce Peninsula Sportsmen's Association did the work.

The volunteers picked up small crosses at the Wiarton Library. Each cross bearing the name of one of our own who died for our country.



Under the direction of Legion official Joe Vanderzand, the volunteers lined up the crosses in alphabetical order. There are two Remembrance events in Wiarton this year. The first is on Friday morning where wreaths will be laid. The second at 11am on the eleventh day of the eleventh month.

Remembrance Day is commemorated on November 11th each year and marks the end of World War I in 1918. It is also known as Armistice Day.

The day is set aside to remember the fallen on both sides in World W 1.



Remembrance Day is a federal statutory holiday in Canada. On Remembrance Day, Canadians pause to honour the men and women who have served and continue to serve Canada during times of war, conflict, and peace. More than 2,300,000 Canadians have served and more than 118,000 made the ultimate sacrifice.



The poppy is the symbol of Remembrance Day. In the run-up to Remembrance Day, replica poppies are sold by the Royal Canadian Legion to provide assistance to veterans.

The reason that the poppy is worn for Remembrance Day is due to a Canadian physician and poet who noticed how quickly poppies had grown over the graves of soldiers who had died during the Battle of Ypres. This symbolism of the blood-red flowers was beautifully captured by Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae in his 1915 poem "In Flanders Fields." The poem was apparently discarded by McCrae but was found by soldiers who sent it to a London-based magazine named Punch.





In 1921, people began wearing the poppy three years after the war ended. For the centennial observance of Remembrance Day in 2021, the Royal Canadian Legion released a commemorative replica of the original fabric pin from 1921.

November 11th marks the signing of the armistice or "peace agreement" between the Allies and Germany at Compiègne, France.

The armistice took effect at eleven o'clock in the morning - the "eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month."

BPSA Remembrance 2023



A youth member of the Bruce Peninsula Sportsmen's Association laid the club's wreath at the 2023 Wiarton Remembrance Day observance. Evalyn Thompson was one of a dozen BPSA members who took part in the downtown commemoration, at the eleventh hour, on the eleventh day of the eleventh month.

The grade seven student said she was honoured to be part of this important service and was "proud to be representing this respected conservation group as well."

More than fifteen-hundred people gathered in downtown Wiarton for the annual Cenotaph Remembrance ceremony. Dozens of wreaths were laid representing a wide array of businesses, clubs, charitable organizations,

municipal governments, veterans associations and families of veterans.

Most of the cenotaph had recently been re-built, including a new backwall. The stone work was done by a talented team from Cape Croker. The BPSA and Royal Canadian Legion Branch 208 volunteers added the final decorative final touches. by Stu Paterson


